

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Western States Telephone Company with office and principal place of business at Holbrook, Arizona, has requested a right of way for a telephone line twenty feet in width and one and three fourth miles in length to the old Kinishba Ruins and, a right of way twenty feet in width and one-half mile in length to the new Fort Apache Timber Company sawmill-planing mill on Indian trust lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Navajo County, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the tribe would benefit by the construction of the said telephone lines to these respective places.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a right of way twenty feet in width and one-half mile in length to the Fort Apache Timber Company and a right of way twenty feet in width and one and three fourth miles in length to Kinishba Ruins as described and delineated on map which is on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, is hereby granted to the Western States Telephone Company, Inc., and that the Chairman of the Tribal Council be authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate said right of way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that because of the above benefits to the Tribe, all damages are hereby waived.

The foregoing resolution was on May 1, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
