


RESOLUTION OF THE


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to be on record in appreciation of this outstanding service by Senator Huso.

BE IT UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the said Council hereby sends its heartfelt thanks and congratulations to Senator William Huso for his dedicated interest and accomplishments for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of Indians.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
