

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mr. Jaek Neal of Gila County, Arizona has requested from the Tribe a lease of those certain unpatented lode asbestos mining claims commonly known as Apache Claims A-6, A-7, A-8, A-9, A-10, and A-11 located in Gila County, Arizona, pursuant to a plat of said claims of which are on file in the Superintendent's Office, Fort Apache Indian Agency, and


WHEREAS, the said Jaek Neal desires to enter into a working contract with said Apache men to mine said asbestos for a price of \$80.00 per ton F.O.B. the mine for all ores with not less than twenty five percent fiber content, and

WHEREAS, it might be advantages to the Tribe to lease the said claims.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is hereby authorized to enter into a mining lease covering the above claims for a period of five years or for so long a period of time as mining operations are in effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the usual minimum annual royalty be provided in the lease.

The foregoing resolution was on July 10, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
