

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the need for employment in the town of Cibecue has been apparent for sometime and the development of nearby timber resources is a logical step for its solution, and

WHEREAS, evaluations of the timber development of the proposed Cibecue No. 1 Logging Unit by the Phoenix Area Office and by the Fort Apache Agency have been considered.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Cibecue No. 1. Logging Unit of approximately 45 million board feet of timber, to be cut in five years, be appraised and advertised for purchase by oral auction bids.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advertisement will specify that a band sawmill will be constructed in the immediate vicinity of Cibecue and that a planing mill and/or other facilities be constructed at the purchaser's option.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plans for the purchaser's sawmill be approved by the officer approving the timber contract.

The foregoing resolution was on August 14, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
