

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, more than fifty (50) percent of the work force on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are now unemployed, and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to establish enterprises to alleviate unemployment, and

WHEREAS, it is also the policy of the Tribal Council to hire and train members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe whenever possible.

BE IT RESOLVED that all managers and supervisors be duly notified that it is the general policy of the Tribal Council that if at all possible a White Mountain Apache should be employed and trained and if this is impossible than a non-Apache after the approval of the Tribal Chairman.

The foregoing resolution was on August 14, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
