

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Council for sometime have been interested in having a bank established on the reservation, and

WHEREAS, it is the Council's opinion that establishing said bank is economically feasible, and

WHEREAS, Mr. T. J. Mahoney, of Florence, Arizona, representing a group of businessmen are now in the process of establishing a bank in Coolidge, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, this group of people have invited the White Mountain Apaches to join with them in establishing a Coolidge-Whiteriver Bank.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Attorney is instructed to investigate the feasibility of such a bank venture and report to the Tribal Council with his recommendations.

The foregoing resolution was on September 25, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
