

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Stacy Classay prepared a number of insignias to be used by the Tribe,  
and

WHEREAS, the Council was of the opinion that the insignia portraying a buck  
deer, white mountains and a stream depicts the Fort Apache Indian  
Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that said insignia is hereby adopted as the official tribal  
emblem.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all tribal and livestock vehicles shall have said  
insignia placed thereon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Attorney is hereby directed to copyright  
said insignia for the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Stacy Classay be paid the sum of \$50.00 for all his  
rights, title and interest for and in to the insignia.

The foregoing resolution was on September 25, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of  
9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache  
Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the  
Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27,  
1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant  
to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
