

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribe had effectuated a loan covering a certain house located in Whiteriver, Arizona, commonly known as the Francis Ivins' premises, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe had further developed said premises, and

WHEREAS, the loan has not been paid nor has the Tribe been reimbursed the cost of improving said premises.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman and Superintendent are hereby authorized and directed to dispose of said Francis Ivins' house at a price not less than a sum necessary to repay the above loan and to reimburse the Tribe for the cost of improving same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to consummate the disposal of said premises.

The foregoing resolution was on January 8, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
