FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, there is some sixty percent unemployment on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, the Tribe's greatest resource is its timber, and


WHEREAS, the sawing of this timber on the reservation would create jobs.

BE IT RESOLVED that hereafter all logging and timber contracts shall provide that the logs must be sawed in sawmills located on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on October 1, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
