

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the sawmill boilers have become contaminated due to the muddy water being pumped from Whiteriver causing said boilers to blow up, and

WHEREAS, the digging of a well might alleviate this problem.


BE IT RESOLVED that if the Superintendent is of the opinion that the digging of a new well and securing uncontaminated water would alleviate the blowing up of steam boilers, that he is authorized and directed to request the Board of Directors of the Fort Apache Timber Company to contract for the digging of a well, the purchase and installation of pipes and pumps from the well to the sawmill.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cost of the above project be borne by the Fort Apache Timber Company from funds it now has on deposit.

The foregoing resolution was on October 1, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
