

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribe on October 20, 1960 entered into a contract with one Doy Reidhead for the purchase of two million board feet of dead timber of all species at \$3.01 per M.B.F., said timber being located on the Becker Creek No. 1 Salvage Logging Unit, and

WHEREAS, said contract was to be completed on or before December 31, 1962, and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 62-117 dated December 5, 1962, the Tribe granted an extension to the said Doy Reidhead to complete said contract until the 31st day of December, 1963, and

WHEREAS, as of the third day of January, 1964, the said Doy Reidhead, Contractor, had only cut 1,348,930 board feet of said timber, and

WHEREAS, the said Doy Reidhead has again requested a year's extension, i.e. to December 31, 1964, and

WHEREAS, it is the Council's opinion that the said Doy Reidhead has been guilty of gross neglect in not harvesting the timber as per his contract.

BE IT RESOLVED that the request for an additional extension of time to complete the said contract is hereby denied.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agency Forester ascertain the amount of damages due the Tribe because of the breach of contract and demand payment for said sum from the Contractor's bondsmen.

The foregoing resolution was on January 2, 1964, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 204).
