

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe, for the first time in its history, is now operating a sawmill planing mill commonly known as the Fort Apache Timber Company, and

WHEREAS, the great majority of Apache men employed thereat had never previously held permanent jobs, and

WHEREAS, prior to the assumption of the Managership of Fort Apache Timber Company by Mr. Hal Butler, the mill was operating at a loss, and


WHEREAS, in the past, there was a great deal of absenteeism, and


WHEREAS, during Mr. Butler's tenure, the White Mountain Apache men and other employees have established an excellent attendance and performance record.

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to commend said employees for the splendid work record.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council unanimously congratulates the Sawmill Manager, Mr. Hal Butler and all of the employees of the Fort Apache Timber Company for the outstanding accomplishment of establishing this work record and for making the Fort Apache Timber Company a profitable enterprise.

The foregoing resolution was on October 28, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
