

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the SALMO GILA (Arizona Native Trout) is considered to be a rare and endangered species, and

WHEREAS, this fish is found only in the headwaters of certain streams on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to protect and preserve the native trout for future generations.

BE IT RESOLVED that the PRELIMINARY MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR SALMO GILA on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation prepared by the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife be adopted in principle, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors be authorized to designate closed and open streams or stream sections in the implementation of the plan.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
