

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is necessary to effectuate economies in the financing of the low rate housing and mutual-help housing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation that the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority be permitted to sell temporary notes, bonds or other obligations as part of the group of housing authorities.

BE IT RESOLVED that the attached amendment to Tribal Ordinance No. 47 be posted as required by the Tribal Constitution.

The foregoing resolution was on December 2, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority, which was created and organized pursuant to Tribal Ordinance No. 47, as adopted by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, and the Public Housing Administration, consider it in the best interest of the Housing Authority to amend such Tribal Ordinance so as to effectuate economies in the financing of its low-rent housing and Mutual-Help projects; and

WHEREAS, it is therefore desirable to empower such Housing Authority to join with and cooperate with other public housing agencies operating similar low-rent housing programs, including the Mutual-Help projects.

BE IT ENACTED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council as follows:

(1) The Tribal Ordinance numbered 47 heretofore enacted on January 16, 1963, creating the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority is further amended by adding thereto the following as subsection p., Section 2, Article V of such Ordinance:

"p. To join or cooperate with any other public housing agency or agencies operating under the laws or ordinances of a state or another tribe in the exercise; either jointly or otherwise, of any or all of the powers of the Authority and such other public housing agency or agencies for the purpose of financing (including but not limited to the issuance of bonds, notes or other obligations and giving security therefor), planning, undertaking, owning, constructing, operating, or contracting with respect to a housing project or projects of the Authority or such other public housing agency or agencies.

For such purpose the Authority may by resolution prescribe and authorize any other public housing agency or agencies, so joining or cooperating with the Authority, to act on the Authority's behalf with respect to any or all powers, as the Authority's Agent or otherwise, in the name of the Authority or in the name of such agency or agencies."

(2) Except as herein amended, the said Tribal Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
