

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, recently there has been an increased demand for an iron-free soft asbestos fiber, and

WHEREAS, there has been ~~several~~ surveys made of Apache asbestos mining claims located on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, it would be economically advantageous to the Tribe to have mining operations commenced on said lands.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Phoenix Area Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs be requested to advertise for a prospecting permit and/or lease in accordance with Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 171, and all amendments thereto of those certain asbestos mining claims located on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation commonly known as the Apache Asbestos Claims A5 thru A 11 inclusive, the plot of said claims being on file in the office of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Tribal Council be and they are hereby authorized to effectuate for and on behalf of the Tribal Council the necessary lease documents for the said prospecting permit and/or lease.

The foregoing resolution was on February 26, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
