

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, a great number of people residing in the areas of Cedar Creek and Carrizo on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation have filed a petition with the Area Director to change the name of Cedar Creek Day School to the JOHN F. KENNEDY DAY SCHOOL, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council respects the wishes of the members of the Tribe, and


WHEREAS, the Area Director has requested that the Tribal Council should voice its opinion regarding the said change of name of the said school.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs change the name of the Cedar Creek Day School on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to the JOHN F. KENNEDY DAY SCHOOL.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Phoenix Area Director request the proper officials in Washington to make said change of name.

The foregoing resolution was on January 8, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (c) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
