

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Sitgreaves National Forest representatives, for and on behalf of the U. S. Forest Service, has requested a right of way, 50 feet in width and containing approximately 1.48 acres across lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe will benefit by the granting of this small acreage inasmuch as the forest service constructing additional roads in conjunction with this area, which in effect, will give greater access to recreational facilities.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency is hereby authorized to grant a right of way 50 feet in width to the U. S. Forest Service, said right of way being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the 46 mile stone on the North Boundary White Mountain Indian Reservation T.2N., R2SE. GOSREEM, Navajo County, State of Arizona; THENCE South $84^{\circ} 03'$ West, 600.18 feet to the true point of beginning. Said point being on the center line of the right of way and identified as road station 13+56.43:

Thence South $80^{\circ} 02'$ West, 138.97 feet; thence Northwesterly on a 4° curve 500.83 feet; thence North $79^{\circ} 56'$ West, 322.27 feet; thence Northwesterly on a 1° curve 220.00 feet; thence North $77^{\circ} 44'$ West, 83.53 feet;

to road station 26+22.03 which lies South $84^{\circ} 50'$ East, 310.07 feet of the $46\frac{1}{2}$ mile stone on the Reservation Boundary. The total right of way in this easement contains +1.48 acres across Indian lands of the White Mountain Indian Reservation, Navajo County, State of Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a plat of said map is on file in the Superintendent's office, Fort Apache Indian Agency to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages are hereby waived, with the understanding that said road is to be maintained by the Forest Service during the time it is used for administration and public access within the Sitgreaves National Forest.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said right of way shall be granted free of cost to the Forest Service and the right of way shall be subject to the applicable regulations of the Department of the Interior for highway rights of way on restricted Indian Land.
