

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the present grazing permits expire April 30, 1964 and should be renewed in accordance with 25 CFR 151.13 and Tribal Ordinance No. 31, and

WHEREAS, sufficient time is not available in accordance with 55 IAM 6.1A (4) (a), "Authority for Advertisement and Allocation of Grazing Privileges", to establish a new grazing permit period and rate per head.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the existing grazing permit be extended for a period not to exceed August 31, 1964, and that the current grazing fee rate shall remain in effect until April 30, 1965.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council shall, by August 31, 1964 establish the following criteria for the new permit period which shall be effective as of May 1, 1964:

- (1) Allocation of range units to the livestock associations and the Tribal Herd Enterprise.
- (2) The kinds of livestock which shall be grazed on each range unit.
- (3) The rate per head per year for cows, horses and burros effective May 1, 1965.
- (4) The number of years for which grazing privileges are to be authorized.

The foregoing resolution was on March 19, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
