

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona Commission of Indian Affairs has presented its proposed 1964-1965 Budget to the Arizona State Legislature, and

WHEREAS, the said Commission operates as a liaison between the State Legislature and the Indian Tribes of Arizona, and

WHEREAS, said Commission performs much needed outstanding work not only for the benefit of the Indian Tribes, but for the benefit of the entire State of Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the close relationship, due to the work of the Commission, that exists between the State Legislature and the Indian Tribes in Arizona must continue.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Budget of the Arizona Commission of Indian Affairs for the year, 1964-1965 is justified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Arizona State Legislature is hereby requested to approve said budget, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Arizona Commission of Indian Affairs and to Gila, Apache and Navajo County State Representatives and Senators.

The foregoing resolution was on January 8, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
