

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Reclamation has requested authority from the Tribe to have access to the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for carrying out surveys and investigations relating to hydrologic and engineering studies for the development of dams, reservoirs, waterways, and appurtenant works, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe would benefit by such studies.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Reclamation is granted authority to have access to the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, for carrying out said hydrologic and engineering studies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the results of said studies shall be made available to the Tribe and/or the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Reclamation is to cooperate with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and advise the said Bureau of Indian Affairs of all work in connection with said studies.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 5 for and 4 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
