

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Penrod Mountain Fire of June 17, 1964 burned approximately 2100 acres of residual timber which is principally ponderosa pine which was first logged during the years, 1930 to 1935, and

WHEREAS, the estimate volume killed is 5,000 cords of pulpwood and 2.5 million board feet of sawtimber, and

WHEREAS, this timber must be logged promptly to prevent spoilage, and

WHEREAS, burned pulpwood trees are covered with carbon flakes to such an excessive degree it increases the harvesting cost and thereby results in less valuable pulpwood product, and

WHEREAS, the sawtimber is in merchantable condition.

BE IT RESOLVED that the fire-killed pulpwood be sold to the Southwest Forest Industries, Inc., pulp mill at the best negotiated price possible, and that the fire-killed timber be appraised and advertised for sale for the shortest period required by regulations.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
