

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the fire damaged timber in the Penrod Mountain Burn area should be harvested as soon as possible, and

WHEREAS, the local competitive market appears to be favorable for sale of this timber.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Penrod Mountain Burn Logging Unit, as presented in the Forest Officer's report covering the recommended sale of this timber and subject to minor changes by the Approving Officer, be advertised for sale by sealed bid at the following minimum rates per thousand board feet:

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
