

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has extensive undeveloped, valuable lands, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe does not have sufficient money to develop these said lands, and

WHEREAS, if there were sufficient money available to develop the said lands, the employment problem would be solved, and

WHEREAS, Congressman Haley of Florida has introduced H.R. 11697 which in effect would establish a fifteen million dollar loan guaranty and insurance fund by the United States Government, and

WHEREAS, the passage of this bill would help alleviate the unemployment problem on the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council unanimously endorses the passage of H.R. 11697.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to all of the Arizona Congressional Delegation.

The foregoing resolution was on July 29, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
