WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, these people, Emmett R. Pipkins, Pedro Martinez and Merintha P. Amos lived on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, amongst the Apache people, for many years, and


WHEREAS, they have always had the interest of the White Mountain Apaches at heart.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Emmett R. Pipkins, Pedro Martinez and Merintha P. Amos are hereby adopted and accepted to be honorary members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the privileges attached to these honorary memberships be as follows: a lifetime permit to hunt and fish within the confines of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation with the same seasonal duration, as well as bag and catch limits, as are granted to regular tribal members.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any or one of them violate any of the Tribal hunting or fishing regulations, this privilege is automatically terminated.

The foregoing resolution was on August 12, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
