

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, U. S. Public Health Service has advised the Council that there is a high per capita rate of cripple hips among the White Mountain Apache people, and

WHEREAS, the Council has been advised that it is probable that these cripple hips could be corrected if treatment was administered during infancy, and

WHEREAS, the U. S. Public Health Service has recommended a harness-type treatment, and

WHEREAS, this type of treatment do not necessitate any surgery or cutting the skin.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby request and offers to cooperate with U. S. Public Health Service in effectuating the above-treatment program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that prior to the treatment being administered, that the consent of the guardian or parents of the child involved, be first obtained.

The foregoing resolution was on August 12, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
