

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Humble Oil and Refining Company of Durango, Colorado has requested from the Tribe, a geophysical-geological oil and gas exploration permit, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe would greatly benefit by the discovery of either the gas or oil on the reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Colorado Fuel and Iron Corporation has a prospecting permit with an option to lease covering minerals other than oil and gas.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Humble Oil and Refining Company, upon the payment to the Tribe of the sum of \$250.00 is hereby granted a non-exclusive prospecting permit for a period of one year to conduct a geophysical-geological exploration to determine if there is an oil or gas deposit on the reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Humble Oil Company shall not interfere with the exploration now being made by the Colorado Fuel and Iron Corporation and the obligation is on the Humble Oil Company to determine the area wherein the Colorado Fuel and Iron Corporation is prospecting.

The foregoing resolution was on August 12, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
