

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Melvin L. Bowers, DBA, Showlow Contracting Company, Showlow Cinders Company, Showlow, Arizona desires to obtain cinders from the McNary Pit, Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, it is economically beneficial to the Tribe to sell cinders.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the said Melvin L. Bowers be authorized to remove 20,000 cubic yards of cinders from the McNary Cinder Pit paying therefore, the sum of 35¢ per cubic yard and removing said cinders on or before the second day of September, 1965.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Melvin L. Bowers be held responsible in seeing that the cinder pit gate be locked at all times when the pit is not in use.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Melvin L. Bowers is authorized to screen the said cinders at the site using White Mountain Apache workers on any job that they can perform.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that every driver employed by the said Melvin L. Bowers check in at the Hondah Service Station prior to loading when removing cinders from the McNary Cinder Pit in accordance with Resolution No. 63-78.

The foregoing resolution was on September 2, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
