

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there are a number of handicapped persons on the reservation who are in need of employment, and
- WHEREAS, there are certain types of industries wherein these persons are capable of working, and
- WHEREAS, Indian Land Incorporated, a non-profit Arizona Corporation, has established certain industries on the Navajo Indian Reservation wherein handicapped people are employed, and
- WHEREAS, it is the issue of the Tribal Council that similar industries be established on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.


BE IT RESOLVED that the Land Committee, the Superintendent, the Chairman and the Manager of the Fort Apache Timber Company secure a parcel of land in close proximity to the Fort Apache Timber Company sawmill which will be feasible for the installation thereon of a manufacturing plant to manufacture various articles including, but without limitation, jewelry and products from scrap lumber.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is authorized to execute a gratuitous lease of said land to the said Indian Land Incorporated for a term not to exceed 25 years.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
