

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 63-65 dated June 5, 1963 the Tribal Council authorized the Branch of Wildlife, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service to conduct a Merriam wild turkey research project on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the said resolution provided among other things that the said research bureau was authorized to trap and retain, not to exceed 36 turkeys for the purpose of conducting crop content studies, said turkeys to be trapped within one year from the date of the resolution, and

WHEREAS, the said research bureau trapped only nine of the 36 turkeys,

BE IT RESOLVED that Resolution No. 63-65 is hereby amended by extending for one year from the date hereof to the said bureau the authority to trap and retain, not to exceed the additional 27 for the purpose of conducting crop content studies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said research bureau work closely with the Chief Game Warden of the Tribe and advise him of all projects and further surrender to the Chief Game Warden, for consumption by the prisoners, all turkey carcasses not needed for research by the bureau.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that except as herein modified, all of the provisions of Resolution No. 63-65 are to remain in full force and effect.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
