

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the timber lying in the Deer Spring Logging Unit is ready for harvesting,
 and

WHEREAS, the local competitive market appears to be favorable for sale of this timber.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Deer Spring Canyon Logging Unit, as presented in the Forest Officer's Report covering the recommended sale of this timber and subject to minor changes by the Approving Officer, be advertised for sale by oral auction bidding at the following minimum rates per thousand board feet:

Ponderosa pine	35,173 MBM	\$ 9.10	\$5.00
Dead merchantable ponderosa pine	- -	2.00	- -
Douglas-fir	2,246 MBM	9.10	5.00
Dead merchantable Douglas-fir	- -	1.60	- -
Mexican white pine	- -	2.50	1.40
White fir	- -	2.50	1.40

The rates for merchantable dead ponderosa pine and Douglas-fir will remain the same for the duration of the contract.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute the contract and related documents necessary to administer the sale of this timber for and on behalf of this Council.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
