

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is programming the building of a school at Cibecue, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the Council has visited the area in which the school is to be built, which area is located one-half mile west of the Cibecue Bridge.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby requested and granted permission to survey an area one-half mile west of Cibecue Bridge containing approximately forty (40) acres on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Cibecue, Arizona for a proposed school site.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is authorized to execute a 25-year lease agreement together with a 25-year option covering said site.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said lease provide, among other things, that if at any time the Bureau of Indian Affairs fails to use the aforementioned site for education purposes, the lease shall terminate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent use his utmost efforts to secure a standard size gymnasium on the proposed site.

The foregoing resolution was on February 11, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
