

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. has requested permission to survey and construct a service line extension to serve the Melvin Narcisco ranch in the Cibecue area, and

WHEREAS, the construction of this powerline will be beneficial to tribal members.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. is hereby granted permission to make surveys for the above powerline in accordance with their application and maps which are on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent is authorized to grant a right-of-way approximately 0.248 miles in length and 20 feet wide to the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc., pursuant to the official plat of said area on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. reseed all areas where vegetation is destroyed by the construction of or the use of said right-of-way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right-of-way agreement provide that Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. shall repair and maintain all fences which might be damaged due to the maintenance of same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived because of the beneficial results that will ensue by the survey and construction of the powerline with the exception of repair of fences and the reseedling of lands which may be damaged by the construction or use of said right-of-way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if and when said Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. abandons the said line and discontinues service to the area, the easement shall terminate.

The foregoing resolution was on February 11, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
