

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a dire need for water and sewage facilities in areas of Whiteriver, Cedar Creek, and McNary, and

WHEREAS, U. S. Public Health Service has established similar facilities in other areas of the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the U. S. Public Health Service is hereby requested to secure funds to make studies and establish a water and sewage system in the Whiteriver, Cedar Creek and McNary districts on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on February 11, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
