

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, because of the increased traffic on State Highway 73 from Carrizo Junction to Indian Pine Junction it is necessary that the road be realigned and new bridges constructed, and

WHEREAS, it is also necessary to construct another entrance and cattle guard at the Canyon Day intersection.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Road Committee is hereby directed to arrange a meeting with the newly appointed State Highway Commissioner, Bus Meade, in Winslow, Arizona, to negotiate the above improvements.

The foregoing resolution was on February 11, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
