

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mr. Douglas Ferrel, dba The Los Cassadores Guide Service, Box 245, Springerville, Arizona, desires to construct a horse trail on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and operate a trail riding business, and

WHEREAS, the proposed trail would start at the U. S. Highway 60 crossing of the Salt River, continue up Salt River to the confluence of the Whiteriver and Black River, thence up the Black River to southeast corner of the reservation where it would enter the Apache National Forest, and

WHEREAS, line camps would be established along the trail at points mutually agreeable to Los Cassadores and the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the construction of said trail would be beneficial to the Tribe in opening remote areas and producing additional income for the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman and the Secretary be authorized to sign and execute an agreement with Los Cassadores for operation of the trail rides for a period of ten years with an option to renew for an additional five years, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the agreement contain, including but without limitation, the following conditions:

1. The Los Cassadores would:
  - (a) Provide all labor and materials necessary for the construction of the trail and maintain the trail in a safe and usable condition.
  - (b) Provide all labor and material for the construction of campsites and corrals, construct no improvements without first obtaining approval of plans and locations from the Tribe and maintain all trails, campsites and improvements in a clean and sanitary condition.
  - (c) Use as much Indian help as possible in the construction of the trails and improvements and the operation of the trail ride activities.
  - (d) Obtain adequate liability insurance with the Tribe named as co-insuree.
  - (e) Permit no livestock grazing on open range at any time.
  - (f) Begin construction within 60 days after signing of the agreement and have the entire trail operational by June 1, 1967.


(g) Sell only those services normally associated with trail riding, hunting and fishing guide services and meals.


(h) Permit free use of the trail by the Tribe, Tribal members and individual riders.

(i) Pay the Tribe a fee of \$1,000.00 per year or 6% of their gross revenue from sales and services while on the reservation, whichever is greater.

(j) Maintain an adequate set of records and accounts and permit these to be audited by the Tribe at any time.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
