

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** the State of Arizona, acting by and through its Highway Department has made application for a highway right-of-way varying in width from 200 feet to 400 feet, a distance of 6.06 miles, across tribal lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, and

**WHEREAS,** the right-of-way being requested is for the purpose of widening the Forestdale Section of the Globe-Show Low Highway in portions of Sections 15, 22 and 27, T.9N., R.21E., Gila and Salt River Meridian, Arizona, which area is more particularly described and delineated on applicant's map of definite location No. D-9-T-221 filed with the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency on March 8, 1965, and

**WHEREAS,** the applicant by letter dated March 8, 1965, indicated that an appraisal of the land needed for the right-of-way was in process and upon completion a Schedule of Damages would be submitted, and

**WHEREAS,** the said Highway Department will abandon the previous right-of-way west of the said present alignment.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that we hereby consent to the granting of a highway right-of-way varying in width from 200 feet to 400 feet a distance of 6.06 miles, as delineated on map of definite location No. D-9-T-221, to the State of Arizona, subject to the following conditions:

1. Compensation to the Tribe shall be based on an appraisal to be made by applicant and approved by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
2. Applicant shall be required to construct and maintain all fences and cattleguards where needed along said right-of-way.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the granting of this right-of-way is subject to the condition precedent that the Arizona Highway Department conveys, transfers and assigns all of the present lands west of the proposed new alignment to the Tribe, which lands will not be needed by the Arizona State Highway Department.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
