

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the LDS Mission, Fort Apache, Navajo County, Arizona has requested the Council to increase the area of ground now being occupied by it in order that said mission might construct thereon, a recreation building, well, leach line and other facilities, and

WHEREAS, the Council is of the opinion that the said mission is serving the Apaches well.

BE IT RESOLVED that the LDS Mission, Fort Apache, Navajo County, Arizona is hereby granted a revocable permit to construct a recreational building, well and other facilities on that said parcel of land containing approximately one acre, a plot of said land being on file in the Fort Apache Indian Agency Office and to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and/or the Superintendent are hereby authorized to issue said revocable permit covering said lands and facilities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that prior to the issuance of the permit the said LDS Mission is to furnish to the Superintendent, Fort Apache Indian Agency all logs of the well including, but without limitation, its pumping capacity and size of waterlines together with all buildings, plans and specifications.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
