

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION



WHEREAS, the Maverick Logging Unit contract, Southwest Forest Industries, Inc., purchaser, approved July 19, 1943, modified March 24, 1958, agreed to recognize in log scaling: maximum scaling length of logs to be 16 feet and minimum length of lumber at least 8 feet in length, and

WHEREAS, the new National Forest Scaling Handbook now provides that the maximum scaling length of logs will be 20 feet and minimum length of lumber will be six feet.

BE IT RESOLVED that the contract be modified in order that the above-mentioned scaling length of logs and minimum lumber length and all other applicable provisions of the new National Forest Scaling Handbook, subject to modifications, as may be approved by the Region III Forester, U. S. Forest Service, be used for logs scaled from the Maverick Logging Unit except that:

- (a) Logs delivered for scaling shall be scaled for their merchantable contents without regard to standards of merchantability based on percentage of sound contents, and
- (b) the over-length on logs for trimming will not exceed one inch for each four feet of long length. Logs which overrun this allowance will be scaled as two feet longer.

The foregoing resolution was on April 8, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
