

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is dire need for water and sewage facilities in the Cedar Creek, North Fork, East Fork, Whiteriver, Fort Apache Junction and McNary areas, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed the matter of establishing a priority for each of said areas.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following priority is established for the construction of water and sanitation facilities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, to-wit:

1. Cedar Creek
2. North Fork
3. East Fork
4. Whiteriver
5. Fort Apache Junction
6. McNary

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all resolutions including, but without limitation, Resolution No. 65-41, establishing a priority for said sewage and water facilities is hereby rescinded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be presented to the U. S. Public Health Service for further programming of the said facilities on the reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman for and on behalf of the Tribe, when he determines it feasible, be hereby authorized to consolidate any of the above projects.

The foregoing resolution was on June 2, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
