

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Navopache Electric Co-operative, Inc., Lakeside, Arizona, has requested permission to survey and construct an electric distribution line across tribal lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, said right of way will be for the purpose of serving the new Arizona Highway Department headquarters in the Indian Pine area.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a right of way be granted to the Navopache Electric Co-operative, Inc., upon filing of an application by said applicant in accordance with 25 CFR 161, subject to the following:

1. The right of way shall be for a period of fifty (50) years from the date of this resolution.
2. Compensation for damages is hereby waived since construction of these improvements will be of benefit to the Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that should the ownership of the electrical distribution system ever be changed, this right of way agreement is terminated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that should the Navopache Electric Co-operative, Inc. at any time fail to maintain its non-profit status, this right of way agreement shall likewise terminate.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
