

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Western States Telephone Company, Inc. has requested an easement for the use of a tract of land at McKays Peak Lookout on Indian land of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation as a location for a metal building and associated equipment in order to establish mobile telephone service in the surrounding area, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe will be benefitted by having more efficient telephone service in the outlying areas which are not receiving telephone service.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and/or the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency be authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to grant a right of way to the Western States Telephone Company, Inc. to construct a building at the McKays Peak Lookout to house radios and associated equipment in order to establish a radio-telephone system on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. The plat of said land, covering a tract 10' x 10', being on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Western States Telephone Company pay to the Tribe a yearly rental in advance, said rental being the appraised value of the land.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that because of the above benefits to the Tribe, all damages are hereby waived.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
