

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Western States Telephone Company, Inc. has requested a right of way on certain lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to construct, operate and maintain a telephone exchange as part of the Hawley Lake Project, and

WHEREAS, this telephone exchange will be operated in connection with the radio-telephone system located at McKay's Peak Lookout approved by Resolution No. 65-103, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe will be benefitted by having more efficient telephone service in the outlying areas which are not receiving telephone service.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a right of way twenty feet in width and 2.709 miles in length as described and delineated on maps which are on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, is hereby granted to the Western States Telephone Company, Inc. and that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency is hereby authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate said right of way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right of way not be cleared except a short section on McKay's Peak.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribe reserve unto itself the right to graze cattle on the right of way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that because of the above benefits to the Tribe, all damages are hereby waived.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
