


RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the master agreement between the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Fort Apache Timber Company approved by the Commissioner on July 14, 1961, stipulates that the Tribe agrees to sell to Fort Apache Timber Company and Fort Apache Timber Company agrees to buy all the merchantable timber, designated for cutting, in the Tribal Sawmill block, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company requests that additional timber on Diamond Creek be made available in order to stock more fir and spruce lumber.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Branch of Forestry cruise and appraise the Diamond Creek No. 4 Logging at as early a date as possible.

The foregoing resolution was on August 4, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
