

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company (a Tribal enterprise) of Whiteriver, Arizona, by contract approved by the Area Director November 13, 1964, agreed to log and pay for the timber designated for cutting on the Elk Canyon Logging Unit, within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid contract makes no provision for establishment of stumpage rates for merchantable pine snags, aspen, and other species, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hal Butler, Acting General Manager of the Fort Apache Timber Company, requested the above-mentioned provisions be added to the Elk Canyon Logging Unit contract, and

WHEREAS, the stumpage rates for merchantable pine snags are normally established at approximately one-fifth the green merchantable rate, and

WHEREAS, stumpage rates for aspen, heretofore sold only under timber permit, are established at \$2.00 per thousand board feet.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following rates and conditions apply for the below mentioned timber:

1. The stumpage rate for merchantable dead timber, all species, is established at \$2.00 per thousand board feet.
2. The stumpage rate for aspen and other species not designated under Section 9 (a) of the contract is established at \$2.00 per thousand board feet.
3. The above stumpage rates will not be affected by quarterly adjustments.
