

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 65-126 August 4, 1965, authorized the cruise and appraisal of the Diamond Creek No. 4 Logging Unit.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Diamond Creek No. 4 Logging Unit as presented in the Forest Officer's Report covering the recommended sale of this timber and subject to minor changes and administrative adjustments by the Approving Officer, be sold to the Fort Apache Timber Company at the following rates per thousand board feet:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute the contract and related documents necessary to administer the sale of this timber for and on behalf of this Council.

The foregoing resolution was on September 16, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
