

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 60-71, October 14, 1960 which authorizes the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise to take over the Reservation Christmas tree business but does not clearly define the objectives of this program, and

WHEREAS, the cutting of Christmas trees should:

- (a) Be cut in a manner so that suitable new trees will develop from the live stump after pruning.
- (b) Trees not suited for sprouting will be near the ground.
- (c) The maximum number of trees to be cut annually will be agreed upon by consultation between the Bureau and the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Manager.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise continue to have the exclusive contract Christmas tree purchase business on the reservation on a continuous basis and that the above-mentioned methods be included in each contract, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 60-71 be rescinded and that this resolution be substituted in its place.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that individual members of the Tribe may be issued Christmas tree cutting contracts in accordance with regulations.

The foregoing resolution was on September 16, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
