

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Southwest Forest Industries, Inc. of Phoenix, Arizona, by contract approved by the Area Director July 23, 1965, agreed to log and pay for the timber designated for cutting on the Coulter No. 3 Logging Unit, within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid contract makes no provision for an uncut strip of timber 300 to 400 feet wide to the adjacent boundary with the Apache National Forest, Mount Baldy Wilderness Area, and

WHEREAS, timber has been designated for cutting in the area within 300 to 400 feet of the Apache National Forest Boundary, and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Interior has requested that a strip 300 to 400 feet wide be left uncut adjacent to the Apache National Forest.

BE IT RESOLVED it is agreed by both parties that a strip 400 feet wide adjacent to the Apache National Forest will be left uncut, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an area of equal size to the beforementioned reserved areas be designated for cutting within the Coulter No. 3 Logging Unit.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
