

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has constructed numerous recreational lakes and facilities in the vicinity of Maverick, and

WHEREAS, many other sites remain to be developed in this area, and


WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is now constructing a highway northeast from San Carlos towards Black River which could, in our opinion, extend across Black River in the vicinity of Ten of Diamonds through the vicinity of Maverick Lookout to the town of Maverick, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council feels that this would be beneficial, in that it would provide vast recreational and fishing lakes and streams to the many tourists and vacationists using the said highway, and

WHEREAS, this road would be jointly beneficial to the White Mountain Apache and San Carlos Apache Tribes.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is respectfully requested to prepare a survey and feasibility report regarding the extension of San Carlos road into the Maverick area.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
