FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has developed an extensive recreation area and homesite project at Hawley Lake in Apache County, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, in addition to tribal investments, many hundreds of thousands of dollars have been invested by private individuals in the construction of homes at Hawley Lake and Apache County has benefited materially through the collection of taxes on these homes, and


WHEREAS, Apache County has provided no services or road maintenance in the Hawley Lake area.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council requests that the Apache County Board of Supervisors accept their just responsibility in providing road maintenance and improvements in the Hawley Lake area.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
