FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that Public Housing Authority is contemplating the construction of fourteen or more mutual aid homes in the Cedar Creek District, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council by Resolution No. 65-91 resolved that Cedar Creek Community would receive first priority for the construction of water and sanitary facilities and has so advised the U. S. Public Health Service of their desires, and


WHEREAS, the people in the Cedar Creek Community have requested that their community receive water and sanitary facilities as soon as possible and they are also desirous of building new homes under the mutual aid program as soon as possible.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Public Health Service be requested to start immediate surveys and plans to supply water and sanitary facilities to these mutual aid homes in the Cedar Creek Community.

The foregoing resolution was on January 13, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
